

FRIDAY 13TH OCTOBER

This is Kjeragbolten (The Kjerag Bolt) in South West Norway. It is a rock wedged in between two faces of a crevice in a mountain. Below the boulder is a 984 m sheer drop.

The rock was deposited during the melting of a glacier during the last ice age around 50,000 years ago.

It's a popular tourist spot, with queues of up to an hour to stand on the rock and have pictures taken, despite the long 4-5 hour hike to the spot from the nearest road.

There are no safety rails, however there is no record of anyone ever falling from the rock.
